HIGH-SPEED RAIL STATION PLANNING

- Readiness for Ridership
 - » Accessible: Easily accessible by all modes of transportation
 - » Integrated: Integrates with the surrounding community creating a welcoming and inviting place
 - » Connected: Connects to the broader city and region
 - » Functional: Provides a safe place for passengers to move freely to, through and from the station



HIGH-SPEED RAIL STATION PLANNING

- Readiness for Development
 - » Prepared: Local plans and policies that are supportive and promote High-Speed Rail-oriented development
 - » Proactive: Attract investment to the station area



STATION PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

- Increase mobility
- Support intermodal transportation (emphasize bike and pedestrian)
- Incorporate community objectives
- Encourage transit-oriented development
- Foster economic development
- Design sustainable buildings






BURBANK AIRPORT STATION

- Connects to:

- » Local and regional buses, including North Hollywood/Burbank Bus Line 154
- » Metrolink lines: Antelope Valley Line and Ventura County Line
- » Amtrak Pacific Surfliner and Thruway Bus Route 1a & 1c



LOS ANGELES UNION STATION

- Connects to:

- » Local and regional buses
- » Metro rail: Red/Purple and Gold Lines
- » Metrolink lines: Antelope Valley, Inland Empire-OC, Orange County, Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura County, 91
- » Amtrak rail and buses
- » Private bus: Greyhound, Megabus, Bolt Bus, LAX Flyaway, etc.
- » Regional Connector (under construction)



KEY CONNECTIONS IN DOWNTOWN LOS ANGELES

- Link to world-class transit center
 - » Los Angeles Union Station
- Connections to full range of existing and planned transit modes
- Integration with downtown communities wider region
- Sensitivity to historical, environmental and cultural resources
 - » “S”-curve alignment to the south
- Ongoing planning with City of Los Angeles, historic neighborhoods, Los Angeles River groups, others
